This method addresses the root cause of roof discoloration and deterioration while preserving the integrity of shingles and maintaining warranty protection.

The distinction between these methods carries particular significance in humid climates where algae and mold growth on roofing materials represents a documented structural issue rather than merely a cosmetic concern. Research indicates that certain types of algae, particularly *Gloeocapsa magma*, feed on the limestone filler commonly used in asphalt shingles, gradually compromising the roof's protective capabilities and reducing its expected lifespan.

"Property owners deserve to understand that roof cleaning involves more than aesthetic considerations," stated John McCloud, President of Gorilla Kleen. "When contractors use high-pressure methods on residential roofs, they risk causing immediate physical damage and potentially voiding warranties that homeowners depend on for protection against defects. The roofing industry has increasingly recognized soft washing as the appropriate standard for residential roof maintenance. This includes confirming the use of appropriate pressure settings, typically below 100 PSI for most residential roofing materials, and the application of cleaning solutions specifically formulated for roof surfaces.
